#### First Reading Jeremiah 17.5-10

- $^{\mathtt{5}}\,\mathsf{Thus}\,\mathsf{says}\,\mathsf{the}\,\mathsf{LORD}$  :
- Cursed are those who trust in mere mortals and make mere flesh their strength, whose hearts turn away from the LORD.
- <sup>6</sup> They shall be like a shrub in the desert, and shall not see when relief comes.
- They shall live in the parched places of the wilderness, in an uninhabited salt land.
- <sup>7</sup> Blessed are those who trust in the LORD, whose trust is the LORD.
- <sup>8</sup> They shall be like a tree planted by water, sending out its roots by the stream.
- It shall not fear when heat comes, and its leaves shall stay green;
- in the year of drought it is not anxious, and it does not cease to bear fruit.
- The heart is devious above all else; it is perverse who can understand it?

<sup>10</sup> I the LORD test the mind and search the heart, to give to all according to their ways, according to the fruit of their doings.

#### Psalm 1

- <sup>1</sup> Blessed are they who have not walked in the counsel of the ungodly: nor followed the way of sinners, nor taken their seat amongst the scornful.
- <sup>2</sup> But their delight is in the law of the Lord: and on that law will they ponder day and night.
- <sup>3</sup> They are like trees planted beside streams of water: that yield their fruit in due season.
- <sup>4</sup> Their leaves also shall not wither: and look, whatever they do, it shall prosper.
- <sup>5</sup> As for the ungodly, it is not so with them: they are like the chaff which the wind scatters.
- <sup>6</sup> Therefore the ungodly shall not stand up at the judgement:

nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous.

<sup>7</sup> For the Lord cares for the way of the righteous: but the way of the ungodly shall perish.

### Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15.12-20

Now if Christ is proclaimed as raised from the dead, how can some of you say there is no resurrection of the dead? <sup>13</sup> If there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ has not been raised; <sup>14</sup> and if Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain and your faith has been in vain. <sup>15</sup> We are even found to be misrepresenting God, because we testified of God that he raised Christ—whom he did not raise if it is true that the dead are not raised. <sup>16</sup> For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised. <sup>17</sup> If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. <sup>18</sup> Then those also who have died in Christ have perished. <sup>19</sup> If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied. <sup>20</sup> But in

fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died.

#### Gospel: Luke 6.17-26

The Gospel according to Luke, Chapter 6, beginning at the 17th verse.

- <sup>17</sup> He came down with them and stood on a level place, with a great crowd of his disciples and a great multitude of people from all Judea, Jerusalem, and the coast of Tyre and Sidon.
- <sup>18</sup> They had come to hear him and to be healed of their diseases; and those who were troubled with unclean spirits were cured.
- <sup>19</sup> And all in the crowd were trying to touch him, for power came out from him and healed all of them.
- <sup>20</sup> Then he looked up at his disciples and said:
- 'Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God.
- <sup>21</sup> 'Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you will be filled.
- 'Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh.
- <sup>22</sup> 'Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the Son of Man.
- <sup>23</sup> Rejoice on that day and leap for joy, for surely your reward is great in heaven; for that is what their ancestors did to the prophets.
- <sup>24</sup> 'But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation.
- <sup>25</sup> 'Woe to you who are full now, for you will be hungry.
- 'Woe to you who are laughing now,

for you will mourn and weep.

<sup>26</sup> 'Woe to you when all speak well of you, for that is what their ancestors did to the false prophets.
