Acts 5.27-32

<sup>27</sup> They brought the apostles in, made them stand before the Council, and the High Priest questioned them. <sup>28</sup> "We gave you strict orders not to teach in the name of this man," he said; "but see what you have done! You have spread your teaching all over Jerusalem, and you want to make us responsible for his death!"

the other apostles answered, "We must obey God, not men. <sup>30</sup> The God of our ancestors raised Jesus from death, after you had killed him by nailing him to a cross. <sup>31</sup> God raised him to his right side as Leader and Savior, to give the people of Israel the opportunity to repent and have their sins forgiven. <sup>32</sup> We are witnesses to these things—we and the Holy Spirit, who is God's gift to those who obey him."

**Gospel:** The Gospel according to John, Chapter 20, beginning at the 19th verse.

### Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

<sup>19</sup> It was late that Sunday evening, and the disciples were gathered together behind locked doors, because they were afraid of the Jewish authorities. Then Jesus came and stood among them. "Peace be with you," he said. <sup>20</sup> After saying this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy at seeing the Lord. <sup>21</sup> Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father sent me, so I send you." <sup>22</sup> Then he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. <sup>23</sup> If you forgive people's sins, they are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven."

<sup>24</sup>One of the twelve disciples, Thomas (called the Twin), was not with them when Jesus came. <sup>25</sup>So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord!"

Thomas said to them, "Unless I see the scars of the nails in his hands and put my finger on those scars and my hand in his side, I will not believe."

<sup>26</sup> A week later the disciples were together again indoors, and Thomas was with them. The doors were locked, but lesus came and stood among

with them. The doors were locked, but Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." <sup>27</sup> Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and look at my hands; then reach out your hand and put it in my side. Stop your doubting, and believe!" <sup>28</sup> Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!"

<sup>29</sup> Jesus said to him, "Do you believe because you see me? How happy are those who believe without seeing me!"

<sup>30</sup> In his disciples' presence Jesus performed many other miracles which are not written down in this book. <sup>31</sup> But these have been written in order that you may believe<sup>[a]</sup> that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that

through your faith in him you may have life. For the Gospel of the Lord, **praise to you Lord Jesus Christ**
