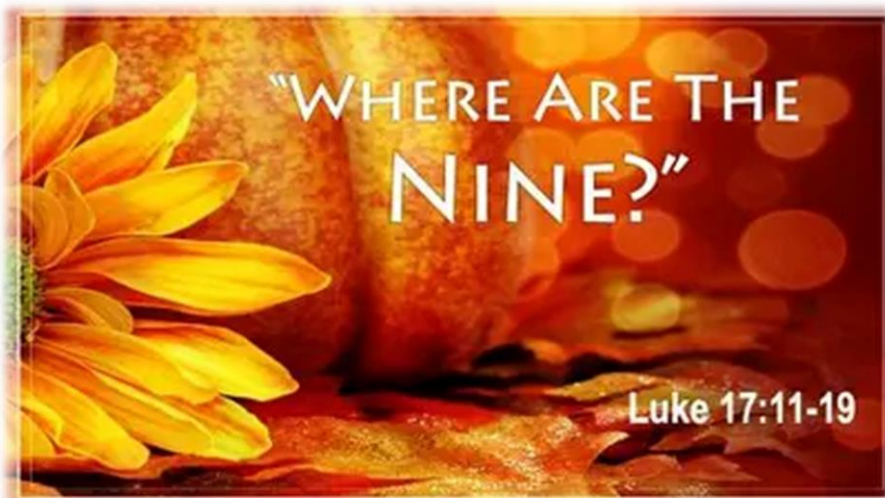

Prayer for Archbishop (elect) of Canterbury

Almighty God, by your Son Jesus Christ you gave many excellent gifts to your apostles, and commanded them to feed your flock: bless your servant Sarah, now called to the office of Archbishop of Canterbury.

So fill her with your truth, and clothe her with holiness, that as a shepherd of the Anglican Communion she may diligently preach your word, and rightly teach your people, to the glory of your name, and the benefit of your Church. We ask this in the name of the Good Shepherd, even Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

First Reading: Jeremiah 29: 1, 4-7

I wrote a letter to the priests, the prophets, the leaders of the people, and to all the others whom Nebuchadnezzar had taken away as prisoners from Jerusalem to Babylonia. ⁴“The LORD Almighty, the God of Israel, says to all those people whom he allowed Nebuchadnezzar to take away as prisoners from Jerusalem to Babylonia: ⁵ ‘Build houses and settle down. Plant gardens and eat what you grow in them. ⁶ Marry and have children. Then let your children get married, so that they also may have children. You must increase in numbers and not decrease. ⁷ Work for the good of the cities where I have made you go as prisoners. Pray to me on their behalf, because if they are prosperous, you will be prosperous too.

Psalm 66: 1-11

1 O shout with joy to God, all the earth:
sing to the honour of his name,
and give him glory as his praise.

**2 Say to God 'How fearful are your works:
because of your great might
your enemies shall cower before you.'**

3 All the earth shall worship you:
and sing to you, and sing praises to your name.

**4 Come then and see what God has done:
how terrible are his dealings with the children of Adam.**

5 He turned the sea into dry land,
they crossed the river on foot:
then were we joyful because of him.

**6 By his power he rules for ever,
his eyes keep watch on the nations:
and rebels shall never rise against him.**

7 O bless our God, you peoples:
and cause his praises to resound,

**8 Who has held our souls in life:
who has not suffered our feet to slip.**

9 For you have proved us, O God:
you have tried us as silver is tried.

**10 You brought us into the net:
you laid sharp torment on our loins.**

11 You let our enemies ride over our heads,
we went through fire and water:
but you brought us out into a place of liberty.

Second Reading 2 Timothy 2: 1-15

As for you, my son, be strong through the grace that is ours in union with Christ Jesus. ² Take the teachings that you heard me proclaim in the presence of many witnesses, and entrust them to reliable people, who will be able to teach others also. ³ Take your part in suffering, as a loyal soldier of Christ Jesus. ⁴ A soldier on active duty wants to please his commanding officer and so does not get mixed up in the affairs of civilian life. ⁵ An athlete who runs in a race cannot win the prize unless he obeys the rules. ⁶ The farmer who has done the hard work should have the first

share of the harvest. ⁷ Think about what I am saying, because the Lord will enable you to understand it all.

⁸ Remember Jesus Christ, who was raised from death, who was a descendant of David, as is taught in the Good News I preach. ⁹ Because I preach the Good News, I suffer and I am even chained like a criminal. But the word of God is not in chains, ¹⁰ and so I endure everything for the sake of God's chosen people, in order that they too may obtain the salvation that comes through Christ Jesus and brings eternal glory. ¹¹ This is a true saying:

“If we have died with him, we shall also live with him.

¹² If we continue to endure, we shall also rule with him.

If we deny him, he also will deny us.

¹³ If we are not faithful, he remains faithful, because he cannot be false to himself.”

¹⁴ Remind your people of this, and give them a solemn warning in God's presence not to fight over words. It does no good, but only ruins the people who listen. ¹⁵ Do your best to win full approval in God's sight, as a worker who is not ashamed of his work, one who correctly teaches the message of God's truth.

Gospel: Luke 17: 11-19

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke, Chapter 17, beginning at the eleventh verse. **Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

As Jesus made his way to Jerusalem, he went along the border between Samaria and Galilee. ¹² He was going into a village when he was met by ten men suffering from a dreaded skin disease. They stood at a distance ¹³ and shouted, “Jesus! Master! Have pity on us!”

¹⁴ Jesus saw them and said to them, “Go and let the priests examine you.”

On the way they were made clean. ¹⁵ When one of them saw that he was healed, he came back, praising God in a loud voice. ¹⁶ He threw himself to the ground at Jesus' feet and thanked him. The man was a Samaritan. ¹⁷ Jesus spoke up, “There were ten who were healed; where are the other nine? ¹⁸ Why is this foreigner the only one who came back to give thanks to God?” ¹⁹ And Jesus said to him, “Get up and go; your faith has made you well.”

This is the Gospel of the Lord, praise **to you Lord Jesus Christ.**

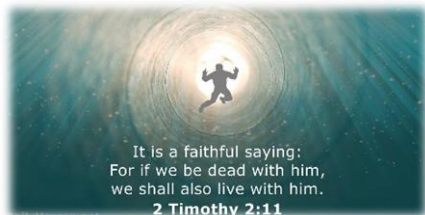
