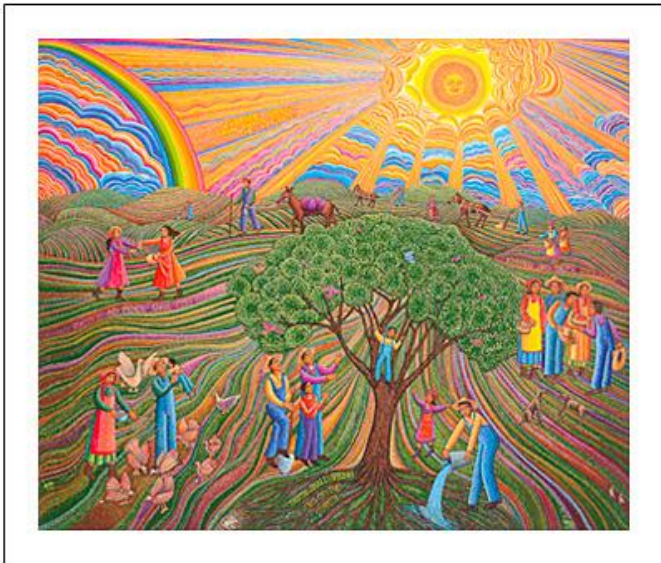
Gospel:

Luke10.1-9

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke, Chapter 10, beginning at the 1st verse. **Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

10 After this the Lord chose another seventy-two^[a] men and sent them out two by two, to go ahead of him to every town and place where he himself was about to go. ²He said to them, “There is a large harvest, but few workers to gather it in. Pray to the owner of the harvest that he will send out workers to gather in his harvest. ³Go! I am sending you like lambs among wolves. ⁴Don't take a purse or a beggar's bag or shoes; don't stop to greet anyone on the road. ⁵Whenever you go into a house, first say, ‘Peace be with this house.’ ⁶If someone who is peace-loving lives there, let your greeting of peace remain on that person; if not, take back your greeting of peace. ⁷Stay in that same house, eating and drinking whatever they offer you, for workers should be given their pay. Don't move around from one house to another. ⁸Whenever you go into a town and are made welcome, eat what is set before you, ⁹heal the sick in that town, and say to the people there, ‘The Kingdom of God has come near you.’

This is the Gospel of the Lord, praise **to you Lord Jesus Christ.**

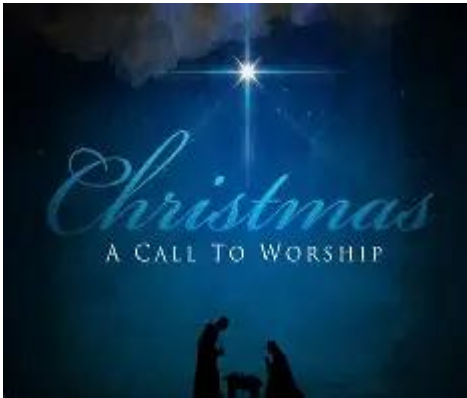


Operation Christmas Child – Samaritan’s purse.
